657 – Revenues from Public and Private Grants

Purpose

The Green Lake Public School District has established a mission of creating an environment in which all students can reach their full potential. Achieving this mission requires the commitment of resources to support high achievement.

While the Green Lake School District is supported through funds provided by federal, state, and local tax sources, the Board of Education will seek as many sources of revenue as possible to supplement these sources to meet our mission. Therefore, the Board encourages development and submission of grant proposals to public and private funding sources.

All proposals shall request the maximum administrative/indirect cost rate allowed by the funding source, or as already negotiated between the school district and that funding source.

Notice of grant proposals less than \$5000 will be given to the Superintendent or principal, who pass on notice of all proposals to the Board. Proposals for grants of \$5,000 or more shall be presented to the Board for approval in a written or verbal summary, which will include:

- a.) a description of the project;
- b.) how the project relates to the mission and goals of the District;
- c.) proposed sources for any matching funds.

The Board will be informed of grant applications that do not require matching funds by the district. The Board must approve any application requiring matching funds of \$5000 or more.

In the event that an Educational Foundation or other entity wishes to extend Grant Funds directly to the District, the grant must be approved by the Board and meet the following criteria:

- 1.) The purpose must relate clearly to the mission and goals of the District.
- 2.) There must be measures for evaluating the activity or project.
- 3.) The grant must conform to state and federal laws and Board policy.
- 4.) The grant must outline coordination and specific project considerations, including scheduling, staffing, resources, etc.

The District shall not discriminate in the acceptance of any grant or other aid, benefit or service to students from any public or private agency, organization, or person.
